# **Spotted Knapweed**

Centaurea stoebe or C. biebersteinii



This branched, upright, scrawny plant has:

- Leaves in the 1<sup>st</sup> year form a low gray-green rosette on the ground. Then in the 2<sup>nd</sup> year, leaves are less significant as they stagger along the main stem, growing smaller near the top.
- Stems are green, branching on the upper half. Each branch has a small, egg-shaped flower bud at its tip, with black-tipped bracts.
- Flowers are 1" pink/purple at the tips of their 8"-4' branches from June-November, initially blooming at the same time as purple clover.
- Seeds follow the flowers, up to 1,000 seeds per plant.





## **HOW TO CONTROL:**

- Hand-pull entire plant in a circle 5-6" from its base before seed-time. Cut 7" deep so root pieces will not sprout. Repeat. Sow seeds of a desirable plant to discourage recurrence of Knapweed.
- If herbicide treatment is necessary, and if beyond 25' from water, spray leaves on the ground before stems elongate: Apply Milestone at 7 oz/100 gal. when plants are actively growing, or cut off flower heads and bend stems into a dish of 20% glyphosate. Bag and dispose of all cut plant parts.
- Continue control efforts until seed bank is exhausted.

**NOTES:** Wear protection when handling Knapweed as plant chemicals are thought to be carcinogenic in large quantities.

Centaurea stroebe is allelopathic, meaning its roots chemically suppress germination of adjacent plants.
